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

Key tasks of the Researcher include:


- Conducting cultural heritage assessments, historical research and associated work.







#### **Septic and Electrical Notice**



As many people are looking to add electrical, septic and water services to their property, the following information is to be of use for best practices here at Splatsin.

- 1. All sewerage systems should follow FNHA guidelines, be installed by a certified septic installer, and the paperwork submitted to the First Nations Health Authority. Forms are in house at the Splatsin Housing office.
- 2. All electrical work should be performed by approved electrical contractors, and proper drawings given to you upon completion for safety and reference

purposes.

- 3. Electrical permits may need to be obtained. Check with the Electrical Safety Authority before performing work. www.safetyauthority.ca
- 4. All water works should be performed by qualified persons. No hook ups into the Splatsin System will be allowed without permission and oversight of the Splatsin Public Works team
