CONSTANCE'S KITCHEN

Cranberry White Chocolate Oat Cookies

Ingredients

- $\frac{1}{2}$ c. unsalted butter
- $\frac{1}{2}$ c. white sugar
- $\frac{1}{4}$ c. brown sugar
- 1 egg
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. vanilla
- $\frac{3}{4}$ c. all-purpose flour
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. baking powder

- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$ c. old fashioned oats
- 1 c. fresh cranberries, chopped
- ½ c. white chocolate chips


Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350* and line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. Use a mixer to cream the butter then add both the white and brown sugar and mix until fluffy.
- 3. Add the egg and vanilla, mixing well.
- 4. Sift in the flour, baking powder and salt. Add the oats and mix until just combined
- 5. Mix in the cranberries and white chocolate.
- Drop spoonful of dough onto the lined cookie sheet 2 inches apart.
- 7. Bake in the oven for 8-10 minutes
- 8. Remove from the oven and let the cookies cool on the pan for a few minutes before transferring them to a wire cooling rack.






