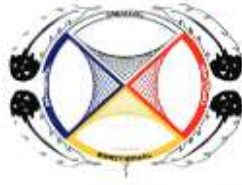

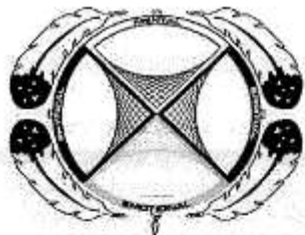

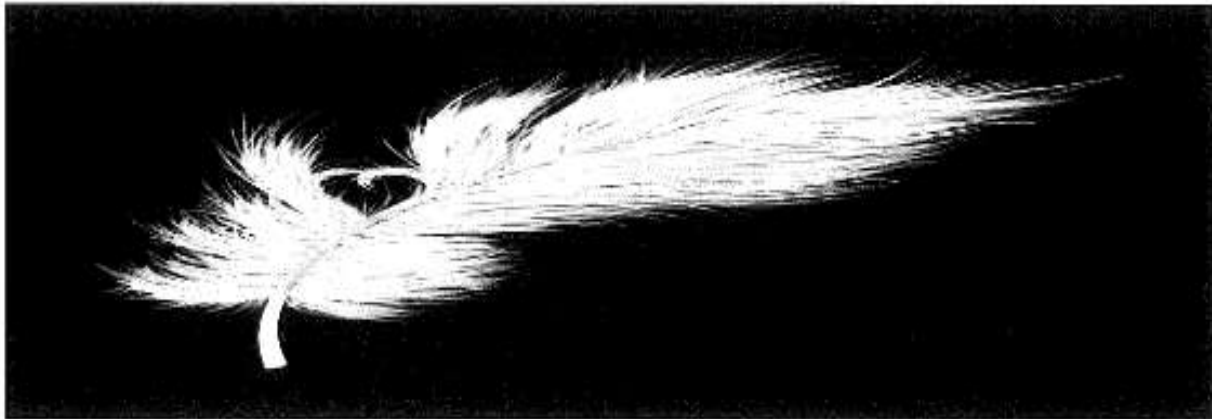

May 9, 2016

Good Day:

I'm sending out a reminder regarding monthly declarations. Each month, in order to receive a Social Assistance Cheque, you are **required** to fill out, fully, a declaration slip, which Megan has at reception and it has to be handed in by the **15th of each month**.

This will be the only notice regarding this, all declarations are being recorded and date stamped by Megan, and the 15th, at the end of the day, will be the only time I will be grabbing the declarations.

Declarations are required by **ALL** clients, whether you're an employable single, family, couple, PPMB, or PWD.

If your declaration is handed in after the 15th, there will be a wait period of up to a week after cheque day.

There's a sign behind Megan's desk that says the following:

Absolutely

No alcohol or drugs will be tolerated when the SA cheques are issued or the cheque will be held until further notice.

Mandate for declaration slips 15th of every month.

- ✓ To support economic development to reduce conflicts regarding land use.

Land use planning (LUP) is primarily concerned with managing land and resources and affects almost every aspect of community life, whether it is where people live, where roads and buildings are built or where people work and carry out their cultural practices and protocols. LUP is a process where people come together to make decisions about the future, weighing every possible variable that can be thought of and coming up with the principles, goals, objectives, rules and regulations that will guide future use of land. A major function of land use planning is to define how land is used and managed, based on the values, needs, services and vision of the community. A land use plan should reflect the community's priorities, environmental conditions, future needs, including economic development in particular.

SLATSIN LAND CODE DEVELOPMENT Briefing Note to Membership

What is The Framework Agreement (FA)?

The purpose of the FA is to allow SplatSIN to resume control over our lands and resources for the use and benefit of our members, without Government interference, by replacing the Indian Act with SplatSIN made laws.

- Provides SplatSIN the option of exercise control over their lands and resources outside of the Indian Act
- SplatSIN would gain powers and governance authority

The Framework Agreement is entirely community driven and can only be undertaken with the consent of the community.

Our members are in Control of Land Governance

SplatSIN will need to:

- creating its own **Land Code is about us! (LC)**; replaces the 32 land management sections under the Indian Act
- enter into an **Individual Agreement (IA)** with Canada; identifies what will be transferred into FN control
- develop a **Community Ratification Process (CRP)**; the process to be followed for membership's vote on the above two documents
- Timeframe for SplatSIN to complete activities is 24 months (Apr 2019)



Background

- Expression of Interest by Splat sin Indian Band BCR July 21, 2015
- Feb 21, 2017 – Splat sin was selected to be a signatory to the Framework Agreement and provided consent to such adhesion
- May 15, 2017 – effective date for the Implementation Document that was signed by all Parties (Splat sin, INAC, RC)

External Supporting Roles for the Splat sin Land Code Developmental Process.

- **Lands Advisory Board (LAB)** - Elected political body comprised of 10 Board Members + the Chairman across 3 regions in Canada (BC, Prairies, East)
- **FNLM Resource Centre (RC)** - Technical Body supporting developmental and operational communities with Day-to-day operations and technical advice
- **Verifier** - Independent person jointly appointed by Splat sin/INAC to confirm that the Community Ratification Process (CRP) and Land Code (LC) are consistent with the Framework Agreement
- **Natural Resources Canada (NRCan)** - Research and compilation of Land Description Reports (includes boundary description, administrative sketches and research documentation)
- **Indigenous & Northern Affairs Canada (INAC)** - responsible for the completion of the Individual Agreement (IA) and the various appendices. Assists First Nations cooperatively on completing Environmental Site Assessment work. The finalization of the land description with NRCan

LAND CODE: FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Taking Responsibility for Land Management

Q1. What is a Land Code?

A1. A Land Code will be the basic land law of the First Nation and will replace the land management provisions of the *Indian Act*.

The Land Code will be drafted by the First Nation and will make provision for the following matters:

- o identifying the reserve lands to be managed by the First Nation (called "First Nation land"),
- o the general rules and procedures for the use and occupation of these lands by First Nation members and others,
- o financial accountability for revenues from the lands (except oil and gas revenues, which continue under federal law),
- o the making and publishing of First Nation land laws, such as the Land Use Planning law and set out conflict of interest rules for land management,
- o the community process to develop rules and procedures applicable to land on the breakdown of a marriage,
- o a dispute resolution process,
- o procedures by which the First Nation can grant interests in land or acquire lands for community purposes, and
- o the delegation of land management responsibilities, and the procedure for amending the Land Code.

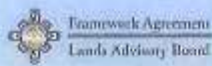
Q2. Is the *Indian Act* still relevant to a First Nation that has adopted a Land Code?

A2. YES. Approximately two-thirds of the provisions of the *Indian Act*, which do not deal with land matters, continue to apply to a First Nation that has a Land Code. For example, the sections dealing with elections and governance continue to apply to the First Nation.

Q3. Are First Nation members involved in developing a Land Code?

A3. YES. The contents of the Land Code are developed by the membership of the First Nation. Typically, a Land Code Development Committee is formed to be responsible for developing the draft Land Code for the First Nation. The Land Code Development Committee is usually comprised of members knowledgeable about lands and resources.

The Land Code Development Committee holds community meetings with the members to develop policy upon which the Land Code is based. Once the draft Land Code begins to take shape, drafts are circulated in the community for comment. Door-to-door meetings with members may also be arranged to allow the Land Code Development Committee and members an opportunity for more in-depth discussion of the draft Land Code.

As a fundamental principle, the development of a Land Code is an exercise in community self-government at a "grass-roots" level.

Q4. Does the Land Code need community approval?

A4. YES. In order for the First Nation to assume control over its lands, the Land Code and the Individual Agreement must be ratified by the members of the First Nation.

The procedure for the community ratification process is developed by the Community in accordance with the *Framework Agreement*. This process will be set out in a Community Ratification Process document that will contain the details of the entire process. The ratification procedure involves a thorough process to locate all eligible voting members and thus providing them with the opportunity to vote in-person or by mail.

Q5. Are off-reserve members involved?

A5. YES. All members of the First Nation who are at least 18 years of age, whether living off-reserve or on-reserve, have the right to vote on the Land Code and the Individual Agreement.

Q6. Is there a verification process?

A6. YES. An independent person selected jointly by the First Nation and Canada, called a Verifier, will monitor and confirm that the community ratification process and the First Nation's Land Code are consistent with the *Framework Agreement*. Once that is confirmed, the process of monitoring the ratification is conducted by the Verifier in accordance with the Community Ratification Process.

TAXATION

Q7. Will First Nation land be subject to taxation?

A7. NO. The current exemption of reserve lands and property situated on-reserve, will continue under the relevant provisions of the *Indian Act*, s.19 & s.89(1) & (2).

The Land Code does not authorize laws relating to the taxation of real or personal property. Such laws may be made separately pursuant to section 83 of the *Indian Act*.

Q8. Can a First Nation tax land under the Framework Agreement?

A8. NO. The Land Code does not authorize laws relating to the taxation of real or personal property. Such laws must continue to be made separately pursuant to section 83 of the *Indian Act*.
